### **Role of the School Counselor**

- Works with students and families from 9th-12th grade
- Meet throughout the year to discuss progress and develop future 4 year plans
- Schedules courses in accordance with requirements, interests and future plans.
- Assists with college/vocational search and application process
- Acts as intermediary with teacher and administration
- Assists students and families to resolve issues
- Provides help in referrals to I&RS, Child Study Team and outside resources

### **Graduation Requirements**

## **Attendance Policy**

- Attendance is taken every period.

### **Option II- Senior Year**

- Work Based Learning (WBL)
  - Students participate in a structured supervised learning environment to explore possible career paths.
- College Experience

  - Through Rider University, are enrolled in Tomorrow's Teachers course of study and also will be assigned to a teacher where they will explore teaching as a career path.

#### <u>Eligibility</u>

- Students must be passing 30 credits at the time of the check.
- Eligibility is checked at the start of EACH sport season (fall, winter, spring)

#### **Honor Society**

National Honor Society

- Scholarship GPA 3.75 (weighted)
- Character voted by every faculty member (2x per year)
- Service 100 hours minimum (must be documented)
- Leadership 3 points minimum (must be documented )

National Math Honor Society

National Science Honor Society

- **Applying junior year**-Must have been enrolled in at least 1 Honors science and be enrolled in Honors science junior year.
- **Applying as a senior**-Must have been enrolled in 2 Honors level science classes AND be in an upper level science senior year

National English Society

• Must maintain an "A-" average in English and can apply the beginning of their junior year
